Wireless is available in all campus buildings and Residence Halls. We also provide a wired network in Residence Halls for your gaming devices. Connect to the 'Curry' Network. At this time, there is no username and password required.

With your Curry Gmail account, you have access to Microsoft Office! You can download this on up to 5 Devices. This is tied to your Curry Gmail account, Curry Grads can keep this for life. Google "Office in Education" or go here: <https://products.office.com/en-us/student/office-in-education> Enter your full Curry Gmail address. You will be provided a link to access the download.

We use SafeConnect, a network authentication software to ensure the Curry network is safe. This program ensures student laptops are secure to use our network. Starting Tuesday, September 5th, you will need to download the program to your device and log in with your myCurry portal username and password before gaining access to the Curry network in your Residence Hall.

You must have a valid Anti-Virus program installed on your Windows or MAC laptop and keep your O/S updates enabled!

Printing Services – all students are provided a 500 page B&W allowance each semester.

Locations for printing are in the Student Center, Levin Library, Kennedy Computer Labs, and in PAL.

If you exceed the allowance during the semester, you may purchase additional prints by going to Afford.com/curry, choose 'Make a Payment' and select the Print Program option.
