A Resident Assistant is an essential leader within the residential community. A Resident Assistant is a person who genuinely cares about others, inspires respect, role models positive behavior, and communicates well with others.

- There's *always* something to do on campus. In addition to bonding with individual residents, Resident Assistants plan social and educational programs to provide opportunities for residents to learn and hang out with one another.
- When life hands you lemons, Resident Assistants help make lemonade. Resident Assistants help with personal and academic concerns and help resolve conflicts that may arise in the room or on the floor
- Connecting the dots. Resident Assistants serve as a resource and point students experiencing academic, personal, health, or other difficulties in the right direction for support.
- **Keep on learning.** Learning doesn't just take place in the classroom. You'll participate in training (both online and in person) twice a year. Training helps you continue to get better in your position.
- It's all about the team. You'll connect with your fellow Resident Assistants once a week at staff meetings and every other week with your Community Director during one-on-one meetings. In addition, supporting team events like Housing Selection, RA Selection, Accepted Students Day, Open Houses, Welcome Weekend, Commencement Week and Commencement are a must.
- Talk it out. Whether communicating with your Community Director, fellow Resident Assistants, or residents, you'll be at the center of communication on a regular basis including phone and email.
- Who you gonna call? Resident Assistants are part of a nightly duty rotation ensuring a safe and secure residential environment.
- **Knock, knock.** Resident Assistants uphold College and Residence Life & Housing policies through consistent and fair policy enforcement and documentation.

Full-time student. You must plan on being a full-time matriculating student with no less than 12 credi
hours per semester for the 2018-2019 academic year.
Getting good grades. You must have a cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.25 or higher.
In good standing. Candidates must be in good financial and student conduct standing (not on a conduc
status at the time of beginning the position) with the College.
All are welcome. While candidates with on-campus residential experience are preferred, commute

students are strongly encouraged to apply.
