

## Honors Sequence in Licensure Leading to an Early Entry in Master's Program and Dual Licensure

**Honors Status\*** - : Direct Accept into the Undergraduate Major in Elementary Education, Direct Accept into the selective Study Abroad program in sophomore year (1<sup>st</sup> semester), opportunity for early field experience in Sophomore year (2<sup>nd</sup> semester, curricular pathway and 4 field experiences leading to a license in elementary 1-6, a curricular pathway leading to a “fast-tracked” Master’s degree and a second license in Special Education PreK-8. Eligible candidates will be inducted to the Pi Lambda Theta International Honors Society. All of these are contingent on candidate meeting all academic and disposition requirements.

**Student Requirements – Minimum of 1500 combined SAT scores (3 measures) or \_\_\_\_\_ ACT Composite Score, 3.4/4.0GPA, summer before Matriculation: take/pass both sides of CLST , AE1305/1310 is waived, interview (phone, Skype, Face to face)**

College Considerations: Will need course pre-registration to ensure honors students stay on track. A single advisor should guide their movement throughout the program(s)    \*\* Seeking a Gen Ed Reduction in these courses that do not address SMKs to be replaced with more pertinent courses . AE course waived.

### **Curricular Changes under consideration:**

Combining two existing Eng. Lit courses into one World Lit offering – would meet SMK standards with one course

Seeking consideration of Gen Ed waiver of some foundational CLAC courses that do not address the Subject Matter Knowledge Standards (SMKs) set for by the DESE, given that the ILS major is in liberal studies (\*\*).

Reducing credits in non-SMK gen ed/CLAC areas – reduces heavy mandated credit load and permits electives and specialized minors leading to “add-on” licenses (highly sought after areas of Mathematics, instructional technology)

Allow MED 6110 Children, Society and Education to satisfy the current ILS upper level Sociology requirement for this select cohort of students

Math will be moved earlier in sequence (as indicated above) to allow for MTEL testing policy adjustments (timeline and gates)

ILS Capstone (new course) moved to junior year to satisfy the Junior Inquiry Seminar in new Gen Ed, then Ed Capstone moves to Fall as shown

PH1060 – Intro to Politics – the SMK is American government and is covered in the social studies methods class
